WHAT IS PERSECUTION?

Persecution is a form of oppression or harassment that can be physical, social, mental, and spiritual, because of your faith and belief in Jesus.

Persecution comes in many different forms and fashions. Most people think of persecution as a physical affliction that someone might receive because of their faith. While this is one form of persecution, it is not the only form, or even the most common.

Persecution can come in the form of social oppression or being shunned by your family, friends, or the world around you. Persecution can also be mental. There might be times when people question your logic or thinking and ridicule you for it. Lastly, persecution can also come in the form of spiritual oppression from the enemy satan. Satan wants you to suffer for, and even question your faith.

Whatever form of persecution you are facing, you can know and trust that the Lord is with you in the midst of your persecution. Not only that, but the victory is already won in Jesus. John 16:33 says, "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."



OBJECTS OF PERSECUTION?



The Bible teaches that those who follow Christ and God's Word and who practice his commandments will be persecuted.

It's important to note that not every time something bad happens to you that it means that you are being persecuted. Persecution is based off of you following Christ and God's word. Sometimes bad things happen but it was not necessarily because of your faith. At the same time, sometimes you might come in contact with opposition or oppression but maybe you were simply in the wrong and that is not persecution, but a consequence.

2 Timothy 3:12 “Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted”

Because we desire to live a Godly life in Christ Jesus, the bible gives us this promise that we will be persecuted. Since we know this, we must be prepared for the moments when persecution comes our way. We are objects of persecution and we need to embrace it.

REACTION TO PERSECUTION?

Love & Prayer: Matthew 5:44 "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you"

Our first reaction to persecution should be to love. Whoever is persecuting you does not know God so they do not know love. Our first reaction should be to show them the love of God as they persecute us. At the same time, we should pray for them, that God would reveal the mystery of the gospel to them.

Mercy: Romans 12:20 "If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this you will heap burning coals on his head"

Give the persecutor the mercy that God has given us in our sins and transgressions.

Forbearance: Matthew 5:38-42

We should withhold retaliation. Jesus tells us to turn the other cheek when we encounter this kind of opposition.

Blessing

The Bible tells us over and over again that with persecution comes blessing. This might not be a physical blessing but a spiritual blessing.

Matthew 5:10–12

Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you.
